Rest easy, Hollywood. Your song lives on.

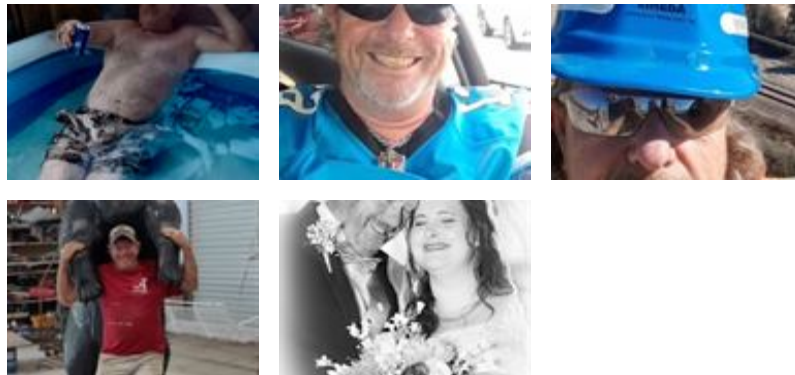
Funeral services will be held on Tuesday, February 25, 2025 at 6 pm in the
