Stephen Christopher McCrea, 35, completed this earthly life Tuesday, March 15, 2022.

A graveside service will be held Sunday, March 20, 2022 at 2:00 pm at Sparrow Swamp Baptist Church Cemetery near Timmonsville, South Carolina.,

Stephen was an Honor graduate of Wilson High School and attended College of Charleston. During IB Art classes in high school, he developed a love of abstract art, a passion which he continued to pursue all of his life. Stephen was co-owner of Railroad Junction an Art Gallery in the Florence Downtown area, when it began its latest revival in 2011. He participated in FMU's International Arts Festival, several competitions, and exhibits with the Florence Arts Alliance, as well as The Florence Museum and various events in downtown Charleston. Stephen also loved planning and coordinating exhibits, including PopCult-True Love and PopCult-Metamorphosis. He later was the owner of Prime Livery an online store specializing in traditional Southern men's wear. Stephen was a brilliant, enigmatic thinker with an eclectic style in both his personality and his physical appearance. He also had

a passion for writing and music.

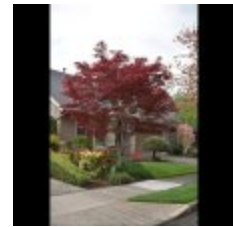

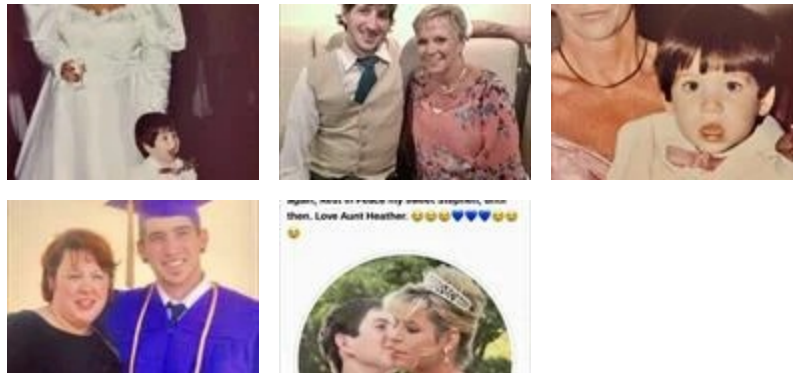

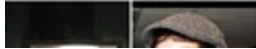

“ I feel like the news of this took days for me to digest. Stephen was one of my closest, dearest friends growing up. We were both somewhat lost, kind of grew up outside of the lines so to speak... I saw his intelligence develop and watched his abstract view of life smeared across canvases, so many canvases. He taught me to appreciate art and how to express myself through it. I can't look at anything without him coming to mind. He was so, so talented. Written in pages of journals that we exchanged back and forth, there was the start our common questions and our misunderstandings of the world... these writings ultimately lead us to start a band together. It was Stephen's confidence in me that helped me start believing in myself. He wrote very odd, sometimes nonsensical sounds with his guitar that somehow, when presented with accompaniment, made music stand out made you feel a connection to the world and with one another. We spent the majority of our childhood, teenage years running around town in our boxer shorts, smoking cigarettes and driving our moms cars to the mall, crying in the backseats because we didn't fully understand how difficult life could be. We thought that we knew everything and had the music to prove it. He marched to the beat of a different drum and I loved the beat that was created. Stephen pushed me to be better. He pushed me to be different. At the core, he was such a shy, kind, and yet very misunderstood individual. We kind of fell out of touch with one another throughout the years... but without him, I would not be the man that I've grown into today. I look in the mirror and still see pieces of Stephen within me everyday, even if he didn't know it. Rest In Peace old friend. I was fortunate enough to know you and I hope you knew that you left a positive impression on me and my life.

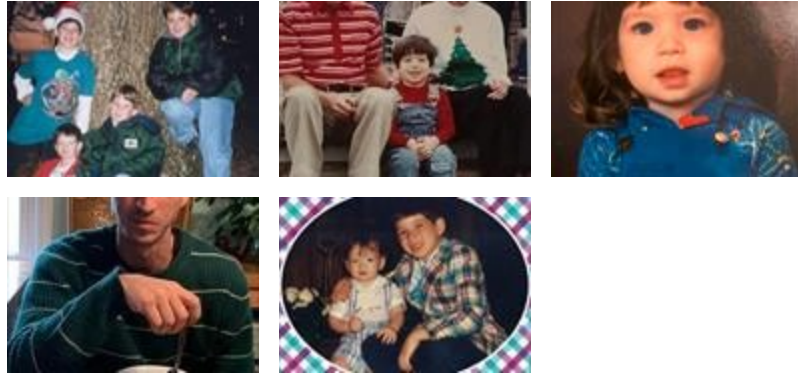
