It is with deep sadness that the Fowler family announces the passing of a beloved father, son, and brother. Timothy "Timmy" Fowler, 46, was born on March 8, 1979, in Darlington, South Carolina, to Jay and Debbie Fowler. He grew up in Florence and graduated from Wilson High School in 1997 before attending Clemson University, where he studied Computer Engineering.

Tim was known for his intelligence, his kindness, and above all, his unwavering dedication to his daughter as a single father. He worked for many years as an IT specialist until his first battle with cancer at the age of 37.

Outside of work, Tim loved building computers, gaming, reading, riding his motorcycle, collecting trading cards, and cheering for Clemson football. His favorite moments were spent with his family and online friends, creating memories filled with laughter, connection, and love.

At 42, Tim received a life-saving liver transplant that gave him four precious additional years—years he filled with gratitude and purpose. When diagnosed with cancer a second time at 45, he faced the fight with incredible strength and

and grace, inspiring all who knew him. He never lost his spirit or sense of humor, leaving a lasting impact on everyone whose lives he touched.

He is survived by his daughter, Rylee Fowler, his parents, Jay and Debbie Fowler, his brother, Michael Fowler, and many beloved friends. He was preceded in death by his paternal grandparents, Tomas and Elsie Fowler, and his maternal grandparents, William and Gladys Mott.

The Fowler family would like to extend heartfelt thanks to Tim's hospice team for keeping him comfortable during his final days at home, his transplant team at MUSC for giving him a second chance at life, and the compassionate nurses who made a lasting difference in Tim's and his family's lives. Do you remember when you and Jae ran the quad into the fence and your grandpaw got banged up when he jumped on to stop it? We were all so scared. I remember Tim and I took both of you out and my son too riding on those and we all had so much fun. We did a lot of things together that year.

I could always count on him. When he was your friend, he was there for all weather. He kept my secrets, he made me laugh, he helped drive me all the way across the country to move with my kids because he didn't want me to be alone.

I will never forget him. He was one of a kind.
